This interdisciplinary symposium explores conceptual metaphors of the human body and how they influence knowledge about the anatomy and physiology of the body or of particular organs. While such metaphors often transcend medical texts and find their way into literary genres, the focus is on these metaphors not as ad hoc literary devices, but as enduring medical explanations in technical texts of medical theory and practice. By means of well-chosen case studies, speakers examine sources of analogies and their medical implications, as well as the limits to which metaphoric comparisons may be legitimately made.
