## **Tim Morgan - Queen Mary University of London**

Tim Morgan currently works at Queen Mary University of London and co-ordinates the “Students as Producers” project. He works with students and academics to look at areas of the curriculum that students have historically found difficult and to see how students can contribute to ‘demystifying’ these areas. Tim originally studied Fine Art at Coventry University before spending 12 months in Jinan, China studying Chinese painting. On his return to the UK he completed a Masters in Interactive Design. He then spent ten years working as an interactive designer in the UK and Germany. After that he worked as an e-Learning Developer in Further Education, working very closely with teaching staff to create bespoke electronic learning resources.
